## A Healing Miracle

A 5 year old girl sustained severe scalds after falling into a large cauldron of boiling spaghetti in Dec 2015. No first aid was administered, patient taken to a large provincial hospital and then referred to Triple B Care Projects. She was seen in January 2017. Initial treatment was with Activon® Tulle and occlusive dressings to the face, neck and chest area. Nursed in the sitting position to help drain the Oedema so as not to compromise the airway.

Regular analgesia was administered and oedema reduced. The burn was mixed thickness, predominantly deep dermal to full thickness.
